Alternating our students' in person start date allows for students to learn the new protocols with fewer people in the building. It also allows for teachers, staff, and administrators to assist where needed with students as they learn the new procedures and expectations.

All students will begin on August 31st with their respective learning option. Students who are remote learning will need to log on by 8am to be considered on time. Teachers will reach out to families about how they will be tracking attendance and what is expected of them for the first few days and in general.

Staggered Entry

7:45- Grades K-2nd

7:50- Family Drop off & PreK

7:55- Grades 3rd-6th

8:00- Grades 7th-8th

***Family Drop off-** If you have students in more than one grade entrance time please drop them all off during the family drop off time at 7:50.

*Staggered start times allows for social distancing to be maintained while administering safety protocol to ensure the safety of our students and staff.

*Temperature Checks and hand sanitizer will be administered upon arrival into the building.

Students will be asked to “Do the MATH”

M: Mask check

A: Ask student how they are feeling

T: Temperature check

H: Hand sanitizer

*Masks **MUST** be worn in the building at **ALL** times.

*Parents **MUST** walk students to the drop off point and wait for temperature to be taken. If student temperature is **100.4*** or higher, the student will not be allowed to enter the building until they are fever free without medicine for 24 hours.

*Students who exhibit two or more COVID symptoms (i.e.-Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, Diarrhea, etc) or identify not feeling well will not be allowed in the building.

*Any siblings of students who exhibit symptoms or have a fever will also be asked to leave regardless of if they themselves exhibit COVID symptoms.

*The student should see a doctor to assess symptoms and/or administer a COVID-19 test.

*A student who exhibits symptoms of COVID will need a doctor’s note in order to return to school if symptoms last longer than 3 days.

*Siblings may return to school the next day as long as they are not exhibiting symptoms or have a fever.

*If a student tests positive for COVID-19 or does not seek medical attention, students must isolate and not return to school until they have met CDC’s criteria to discontinue home isolation, which currently includes:

~24 hours with no fever (without medication) and

~Other symptoms reduced substantially (by at least 75 percent) and

~10 days since symptoms first appeared.

Staggered Exiting

2:45- GradesPreK-2nd

2:50- Grades 3rd-6th

2:55- Grades 7th-8th

*All teachers will walk students to the Parking Lot where they will be picked up by parents. Staggered exiting and having all students being picked up in the parking lot allows for students and parents to social distance while picking up students.

Masks

*Masks **MUST** be worn by all students and staff.

*Lunch is the only time students are allowed to remove their masks within the building as they will be distance within guidelines.

*Students will be allowed to remove masks when outside IF remaining 6ft or more from peers.

*Students may wear a face shield but a mask **MUST** be worn with it.

*Masks must be school appropriate. They can be traditional ear-loop masks, tie in the back masks, or gaiters. If gaiters are worn they must have 3 layers of fabric. **NO** bandanas please.

*Valve masks should not be used.

*Masks should not contain messages or images that would distract from the educational environment of the school.

*Masks will be placed in a **PAPER** lunch bag when not being worn. Students will have their own bag with their name on it. Bags will be replaced weekly or as needed.

*Preschool has a bathroom in the classroom

*Jr. High must be 1 student at a time per classroom.

- *Students must sign in and out and the teacher must be aware they are leaving
- *Jr. High can only go during their **Bathroom Block time**

Title 1

- *Title teachers must pick up students from the classroom & return to class after Title.
- *Desks **MUST** be wiped down after each group/student.
- *Students **MUST** sanitize their hands upon entrance into the Title 1 classrooms and upon re-entrance into their classroom.

Specials Classes

- *Specials teachers will conduct class in the students classroom.
- *Physical Education will be held outside while the weather is nice and then be moved to the classrooms or gym where students will do Yoga and partake in Health Class.

Departmentalized Grades

- *6th, 7th, & 8th grade students will remain in the classroom in their assigned area. Floors will be marked where desks/tables and chairs need to remain. The teachers will switch classrooms to provide instruction.
- *Teachers will sanitize “high touch” points (i.e.-door knobs, desk, light switch, etc) when leaving a classroom.
- *Teachers will sanitize their hands upon entering a classroom.

Breakfast

- *Students will eat in their classrooms at their assigned desk.
- *Food Services will provide breakfast to students in their classrooms.
- *Students/teachers will sanitize desks/tables and hands before and after breakfast is eaten.
- *Students will place their masks in a brown paper bag while they eat.
- *Breakfast in the classroom ensures that students eat breakfast so they have energy to focus and learn during morning classes.

Lunch

- *Students will eat in their classrooms at their assigned desk.
- *Food Services will provide lunch to students in their classrooms.
- *Students/teachers will sanitize desks/tables and hands before and after lunch is eaten.
- *Students will place their masks in a brown paper bag while they eat.
- *Students who bring lunch from home must be able to throw everything out after lunch.

Special Education Services

- *Students who receive Special Education services will be picked up from their classroom by the resource teacher.

- *Teacher and student will remain 6ft apart while working.
- *Desks will be wiped down before and after it is used by a student.
- *Students will sanitize their hands when entering the classroom.

Before/Aftercare

- * Before and after care will be held in the Library and Multipurpose room across from the Library.
- *Temperature Checks (for Before Care) and hand sanitizer will be administered upon arrival into the building.
 - Students will be asked to “Do the MATH”
 - M:** Mask check
 - A:** Ask student how they are feeling
 - T:** Temperature check
 - H:** Hand sanitizer
- *Masks **MUST** be worn in the building at **ALL** times.
- *Students will have an assigned spot to sit. Students will be able to read, work on homework, or other activities that adhere to school health and safety protocols.
- *Students will enter and exit through Door #6. Please ring the doorbell.
 - *Students are the only ones who will be allowed in the building after “Doing the Math”
 - *Students will be brought to the door for pick up.

Remote Learning/ In Person Learning

- * Students will have small learning groups to allow for more personalized instruction.
- *It is Archdiocesan policy that students who are remote learning may not interact in a learning capacity with students who are in person learning.
- *This means that students may not work in groups with students who are not in their learning option.
- *Each option is considered its own class and therefore must operate as different classes.
